ATHLETE CATEGORY:

SARAH CHARLES

Sarah began her gymnastics career at age 5 and at age 17 won her first World championship in the Double Mini Trampoline (2003) and added another World title in 2007. She is a gold medallist at the 2004 Pan Am Games and Indo-Pacific Games.





ATHLETE CATEGORY:

CHRISTI VAN HEES

Christi is a 6-time Canadian National racquetball champion (1997-2008) and a 2-time World champion (1998 & 2006). She captured a silver medal at the 1999 Pan-Am Games and was the #1 ranked player in the world in 2005.

PIONEER ATHLETE CATEGORY:

WAYNE HICKS

To date, Wayne is the only Kelowna player to have his name on the Stanley Cup. He won the Cup as a member of the 1961 Chicago Blackhawks. He played 117 NHL games with Chicago, Boston, Montreal, Philadelphia & Pittsburgh. He helped Kelowna win it's first-ever BC Midget hockey title in 1953.





BUILDER CATEGORY:

ROD BELINSKI

As a head coach, Rod guided the KLO Cougars to 5 Provincial high school boys volleyball titles. His teams qualified for the provincials in 20 of his 21 years as coach. Rod was instrumental in moving the BC Volleyball Championships to Kelowna in 1993 and served as Tournament Chair for 19 years.




BENNETT AWARD (SPECIAL RECOGNITION):

JOHN & JENNIFER HINDLE

The Hindles started the Kelowna Apple Triathlon in 1983. John helped build the junior racing programs at Big White & Silver Star Mountains. Jennifer was a tireless volunteer in the Kelowna arts scene helping with the Ballet & Symphony.



- Began gymnastics at age 5, switched to Trampoline and Double Mini Trampoline at age 14 Competed in first Nationals at age 12 (artistic gymnastics) 2 World Cup champions in Double Mini Trampoline (DMT) in 2003 & 2007 World Games champion in 2005
- Pan Am Games champion in 2004 Indo-Pacific Games champion 2004 Alternate for 2008 Summer Olympic Games (due to injury)

- Silver medal at 1999 Pan Am Games



• 5-time Provincial Boys Volleyball champion (Head Coach) with KLO Cougars- includes 'A', 'AA' and 'AAA' • Undefeated at 1995 AAA Provincials • 1995 Volleyball BC High School Coach of the Year • In 21 years (1978-1998) as head coach, qualified for Provincials every year except once (1981) • Named Honorary Life Member of BC High School Boy's Volleyball • 1999-2005 Okanagan College volleyball coach; silver medal at 2001 Provincials and Nationals • In 1993, instrumental in moving Provincial volleyball championships to Kelowna • Served as Chair of Provincial Volleyball championship tournament for 19 years



2015 Inductee-Pioneer Athlete — Wayne Hicks —

• 1961 Stanley Cup Champion, Chicago Blackhawks (Winger) • To date, only player from Kelowna to have his name on Stanley Cup • Signed with NHL Chicago Blackhawks at age 14 • Played 117 NHL games; Chicago, Boston, Montreal, Philadelphia & Pittsburgh • American Hockey League (AHL) All-Star in 1965 & 1967 & 1969 • Helped Kelowna win its first BC Midget championship in 1953 • Hockey career spans 1953-1974 with junior, professional & NHL
